

How to Survive the Anti-Jobs Future

Mr Jack Sim

Founder of the World Toilet Organization



Widely known as Mr Toilet, Jack Sim broke the global taboo around toilets and sanitation. He founded the World Toilet Organization (WTO), a global non-profit working towards a world with clean, safe toilets and sanitation for everyone, everywhere, at all times. Born in a slum in Singapore in 1957, he learned entrepreneurship and gumption from his uneducated mother who started a series of small businesses. He was also inspired by the gumption of Prime Minister Lee Kuan Yew and grew up watching the amazing transformation of his country from third world to first.

From school failure, he became a serial commercial businessman (sixteen businesses). After attaining financial independence he left the rat-race to become a serial social entrepreneur. After fighting the bureaucrats, he enrolled at Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy and graduated with a Master's in Public Administration at the age of 56. He also graduated at Singularity University's Global Solutions Program at age fifty-nine. Some of the awards he won are: Schwab Fellow of the World Economic Forum, Ashoka Global Fellow, Queen Elizabeth's Points of Light Award, Clinton Global Initiatives Fellow, Time Magazine's Heroes of the Environment for 2008. For his contribution to humanity, he received an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Strathclyde, Glasgow UK in 2022.

How to Survive the Anti-Jobs Future

Mr Jack Sim

Founder of the World Toilet Organization

For centuries, knowledge was power. The arbitrage between those who know and those who don't, would determine their destiny.

Education is an opportunity for people to move up the prosperity ladder. But our current rote learning mode is becoming relatively obsolete in the era of AI, AGI and eventually, BCI (brain-computer integration).

When I was given a 10 weeks scholarship at the Singularity University at NASA in 2016, I was shocked that all the emerging 200 new technologies were anti-jobs.

Since humans can't become better robots, our only chance of survival is to be better humans to prevail over the robots.

Come and listen to how Gumption is now the most essential survival skills that our school did not teach you.

The Future of Global Leadership in a Multipolar World

Kei Koga is Associate Professor at the Public Policy and Global Affairs Programme, School of Social Sciences, Nanyang Technological University (NTU). Concurrently, he is a Nonresident Fellow at The National Bureau of Asia Research (NBR), the United States, and a member of RIPS Research Committee, the Research Institute for Peace and Security (RIPS), Japan.

His research focuses on International Security, International/Regional Institutions (particularly ASEAN), and East Asian/Indo-Pacific security.

The Future of Global Leadership in a Multipolar World

In today's multipolar world, leadership faces the temptation of populism, offering simple solutions that often neglect long-term consequences.

Power politics matters to maintain stability, but divisions within and between nation-states threaten global stability, underscoring the need for unity. Engaging in blame games hampers progress; instead, leaders should focus on constructive engagement and dialogue.

By clearly articulating choices and aligning words with actions, leaders can foster trust and guide societies toward sustainable futures.

Reclaiming Wonder: The Power of Childlike Curiosity

Mr Wesley Ng Student | Global Community Builder



Wesley Ng is an incoming undergraduate and current national serviceman who works extensively with children in multiple roles. As a Global Community Builder and student volunteer at Junior Achievement Singapore, he teaches financial literacy to children, while also leading Cake From The Hearts—a non-profit organization he founded to celebrate the birthdays of underprivileged children.

Through these experiences, Wesley has observed firsthand the natural curiosity, creativity,

and fearlessness that children possess—qualities that adults often lose as they age. His mission is to help others recognize and reclaim these valuable childhood traits, applying them to overcome modern adult challenges and rediscover the things that made life extraordinary.

Reclaiming Wonder: The Power of Childlike Curiosity

Mr Wesley Ng Student | Global Community Builder

As we age, we lose our innate ability to question why and challenge assumptions, replacing wonder with indifference and fearless curiosity with social anxiety. Using age seven as a touchpoint - a time when we were old enough to explore yet young enough to marvel at everything - this speech explores the transformative power of childlike curiosity.

We'll examine how two major factors erode our curiosity: the numbing routine of daily life and the fear of judgment in social interactions. Wesley shares his month-long experiment of living like his seven-year-old self, which transformed not just individual interactions but his entire worldview - from striking up conversations with strangers to rediscovering his fascination with constellations.

The speech weaves together compelling neuroscience research showing how curiosity triggers dopamine release, enhances memory formation, and even correlates with longevity with practical, time-bound strategies anyone can implement. These include the "First Time" technique for daily activities, a "Seven-Year-Old Timer" for social situations, and the "Why" journal for cultivating daily curiosity.

Drawing the crucial distinction between being childish and being childlike, he showcases how great innovators like Einstein and Marie Curie succeeded because of their childlike wonder. In our Al-driven era, where machines can answer any question, human curiosity becomes more valuable than ever. While Al can provide answers, it takes human curiosity to question assumption and imagine new possibilities - making our childlike wonder not just personally fulfilling, but essential for addressing humanity's complex challenges.

Uniformity is Overrated: Speak Up

Jovann is a JC2 student at Eunoia Junior College, which means they've mastered the art of looking busy while procrastinating and surviving on dangerously little sleep. They have no fancy accolades, no groundbreaking research to their name, but they do have an unfortunate habit of going down ideological rabbit holes instead of doing actual work.

Between cramming for exams and questioning their life choices, they've noticed something odd: everyone seems to think they're the hero of history. Every ideology claims to champion freedom, justice, or equality precisely until you disagree with them. This talk isn't about giving you the "right" answers (if they had those, they'd be much richer), but it might make you question just how much of what you believe is actually yours, and how much is just borrowed from the loudest voices around you. And if nothing else, at least it'll be more interesting than another GP lecture.

Uniformity is Overrated: Speak Up

Mr Jovann Loh Student | Advocate

The speaker highlights a paradox: those who preach inclusivity often silence dissent.

In today's hyper-connected world, conformity isn't enforced by law: it's self-imposed, driven by fear of exile. Social media turns expression into performance, where deviation invites punishment, not debate.

This performative conformity is more insidious than traditional oppression. It doesn't just demand obedience, it trains people to anticipate the "right" opinions, shaping beliefs out of fear rather than conviction. The result? An illusion of progress masking intellectual stagnation.

History's greatest minds weren't celebrated for blending in. They shattered consensus. Yet today, we rebuild the cages they fought to break, mistaking ideological purity for true diversity. The speaker seeks to contend that a world without disagreement is a world without growth.
